We enjoy reading books that belong to us much more than if they are borrowed. A borrowed book is like a guest in the house. It must be treated with care. We must see that it sustains no damage. We cannot leave it carelessly and we cannot mark it.

And then, some day, we ought to return it. We treat our own books with affectionate intimacy. Books are for use, not for show. We should own no book that we are afraid to mark up important lines or points, or afraid to place on the table, wide open and face down. A good reason for marking favourite lines in books is that it enables us to remember more easily the significant sayings, and later refer to them quickly. The bookshelves in one's own library

should have no doors, glass windows, or keys so that the books in them should be accessible to the hand as well as to the eye. Books are more varied in colour and appearance than any wallpaper. They are attractive in design. They have the prime advantage of being separate personalities, so that if we sit alone in our room in the firelight, we are surrounded with intimat

friends. They inspire, encourage and guide us in diverse ways.
