SECTION—A

1. Write short notes (comprising of 200 to 250 words each) on any *four* of the following : 10×4=40
- (a) *Nairātmyavāda*
 - (b) *Adhyāsa*
 - (c) *Abhāva*
 - (d) Scepticism
 - (e) Simple and Complex Ideas
 - (f) Induction and Deduction

SECTION—B

2. What is the importance of epistemology in philosophical enquiry? In this connection, discuss Plato's distinction between *episteme* and *doxa*. 20
3. Expound and discuss Kant's distinction between phenomena and noumena. 20

4. Critically examine Viśiṣṭādvaitic characterization of the relationship between *Ātman* and *Brahman*. 20
5. Write a critical essay on Berkeley's *esse est percipi*. 20

Or

Explain and examine Spinoza's notion of 'Substance' as *causa sui*. 20

SECTION—C

6. Write an essay on the debate of euthanasia (mercy-killing) elucidating the ethical point of view of pro-life and pro-choice position holders. 20
7. Examine the characteristics of utilitarian consequentialism and Kantian deontology. 20
8. Discuss Gandhi's critique of modernity in *Hind Swaraj*. What did Gandhi understand by 'true civilization'? 20
