



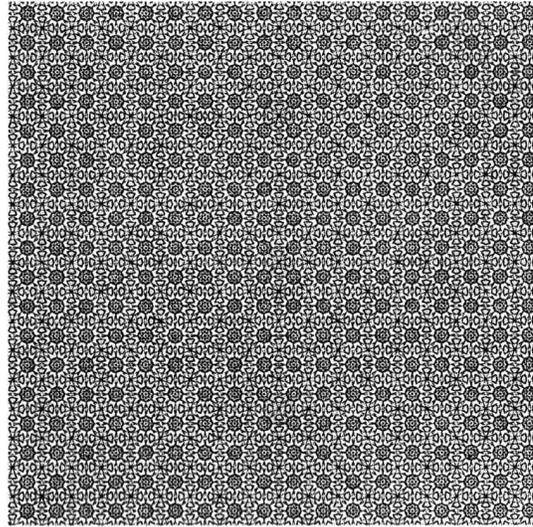
**INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES**
