

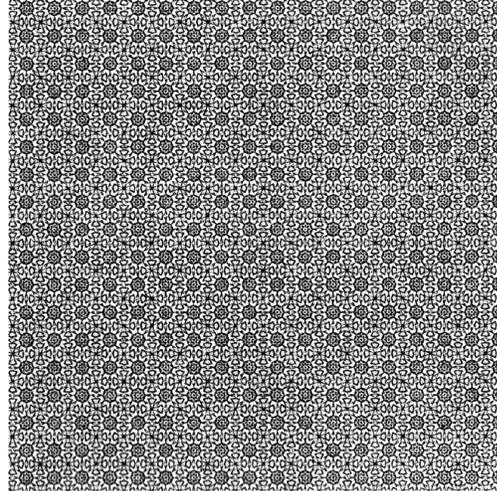
INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES


