

They constitute 75% of the agricultural labours.</p> <p>iv) Bonded Labour system (Abolition) Act 1976 : A legislation was passed known as Banded labour system (Abolition) Act 1976 under this Act the bonded labour system was abolished through out the country</p> <p>v) Child labour and its prohibition: In 1986 Government of India assed child labour prohibition Act. This act prohibits the appointment of children below the age of 14 in any hazardous or non-hazardous jobs. 
